#### **Payments and Refunds**

Payments may be in cash, check or credit card. All checks are made payable to Branford Garden Club. Checks are collected at meetings or may be mailed to the home of Ann Freeman, Treasurer. Typically, the Assistant Treasurer can process credit cards at meetings and events.

*Design fees* – payment is due when you sign up for the class (unless it is your complimentary class). If you cancel *before* materials are purchased, you may be eligible for a refund. Otherwise, once materials are purchased, there are no refunds if you are unable to attend.

Tour fees – payment is due when you sign up. Commitments are made for tickets, transportation, meal reservations and more, based on the number of people signing up. Members are responsible to pay the fees for any guest(s). There are no refunds if you change your mind once deposits have been paid. If you or a guest is unable to attend you may find a substitute.

CONSERVATION & HORTICULTURE

Theresa Donovan & Ivy Bigelow Kim, Co-Chairs



The combined focus and goals are supported by good horticultural practices so working together is clearly a best practice!

Conservation will concentrate on small steps each of us can take to help make a sustainable environment. Projects include recycling, ways to reduce waste and pollution, appreciation of wildlife, with special emphasis on pollinators, and preservation of natural habitats.

Horticulture introduces interesting topics in gardening through Scattered Seeds, posterboard displays, and expertise at monthly meetings. Every month the day-time horticulture table features a topical theme and members are asked to participate at least once a year by bringing in a horticulture specimen to display and explain.

DESIGN: Deb Vallas & Larry Huzi, Co-Chairs

Design educates and practices skills all year long. (1) Members provide a centerpiece for the food table at the membership lunch meeting. (2) A floral design workshop is held at least once each year, generally more. A free class is offered to each new member. (3) Design offers other beautification projects as needed, such as the annual Holiday Wreath Making.

GARDEN THERAPY: Denise Isaac, Annamarie Mercurio, Mary Jo Riddle, Angela Rowley, Marie Tiernan

The purpose of Garden Therapy is to use plants and horticultural activities to enhance the physical, mental, and social health of the elderly and incapacitated individuals in our community. Horticultural programs and seasonal gardening are done with clients at Orchard House, Artis

Memory Care, and the Canoe Brook Senior Center. Flower arrangements and baskets donated by Club members are delivered to Branford Hill Healthcare and Artis Memory Care. Club members volunteer to make fresh flower arrangements weekly for the tables at the Branford Community Dining Room.

HOSPITALITY: Stephanie Dorman & Jaye Andrews, Co-Chairs

The Hospitality Committee provides refreshments for each membership meeting, prepares the luncheon set-up, maintains the kitchen in a proper manner, and clears the tables. The Chair makes the hostess and committee monthly assignments.

MEMBERSHIP: Deanna O'Connell, Chair RECORDS: Ann Freeman PICTORIAL DIRECTORY: Marybeth Ciarlelli

The Membership Chair is the point of contact for prospective members, offering information and guidance through the entry process, new member introductions to the membership, and orientation to the Club programs and activities. She is also the keeper of the Club Aprons (free to new members, otherwise \$20). **Membership Records** maintain member roster with contact information, dues paid, and member status. **Membership Pictorial Directory** updates the online pictorial membership directory in real time to keep membership contact information current. The Club uses online tools to reach every member with news and information and advertise to the public. Tools include: Constant Contact, CTRN Directory, Facebook, Eventbrite, Signup Genius, town online calendars and our website. Anyone with aptitude is encouraged to join the

team to share the tasks and ensure each tool has expert users backing each other up.

PROGRAM SPEAKERS: Daytime: Nancy Judd - Evening: Doreen Larson Oboyski

The membership meeting agendas include expert speakers on a wide variety of topics, with emphasis on mission-driven initiatives. The yearlong program is planned to provide diverse topics of interest to all members at all levels of learning. Expert speakers within our membership are invited to speak along with external professionals.

PUBLICATIONS: Ann Freeman, Nancy Judd, Deanna O'Connell

The traditional print Yearbook has been replaced: print New Member Handbook and Programs & Activities Handbook, plus an online Annual Report and Membership Directory. The **New Member Handbook** includes everything new members need to know about what the Club stands for, what the expectations are of members, and what resources are available to them. The **Programs & Activities Handbook** is produced annually and serves as a resource about what's on the calendar for the current year, schedules and assignments, descriptions of all the committees and who the Chair(s) are. It is made available to every member at the September membership meeting.

PUBLICITY: Marybeth Ciarlelli, Rita Dattola

Publicity supports two key objectives on behalf of the Club: (1) promotes goodwill between BGC and the Branford community by publicizing our citizenship responsibilities, and (2) publicizes the events and fundraisers open to the public to maximize attendance and financial success. Marybeth manages online town calendars, Eventbrite, and Facebook, while Nancy and Rita will handle BCTV and print media.

SUNSHINE & CHEER: Cidy Drago, Chair

Phone calls are made to members who do not have email to share monthly reminders of meetings and events, and any changes to scheduled meetings. Cards of remembrance and cheer are sent to distressed members through illness, accident, loss, etc.

The focus is to organize trips to flower and garden shows, and tours of spectacular public and private gardens which will educate and inspire our love of gardening. Members of the Youth Committee work with children and their teachers to nurture an interest in plants, gardening, and conservation efforts. They assist elementary and middle-school youth with understanding pollinator plant and flower life cycles by planting native and pollinator-friendly flowers around their schools and in other public places. Pre-school children are encouraged to become junior floral "designers" by guiding

them in arranging Mother's Day flower mugs.


PLANT SALE Nancy Judd, Chair


